- Anti-social behaviour:
 - arguing, rudeness, non-compliance
- Ethical violations
- Cheating



- Policy and regulation
 - "Best Behaviour at Bridge"
 - BB@B
 - Law 74
 - + anti-discrimination legislation



- On-the-spot enforcement
 - Tournament Directors
 - Summary "fines"
 - o Laws 90 & 91



- Later enforcement
 - Laws & Ethics Committee
 - Prosecution Panel
 - Disciplinary Panel
 - Pro-bono adviser



Sanctions

- Public admonishment
- Monetary fines
- Suspension from events
- Expulsion from the EBU



- Appeals process necessary
 - On-site Appeals Committee
 - Provided by Bye-Laws as part of disciplinary process



- Other enforcement bodies
 - Club Constitutions
 - "Law of the land" –
 national laws of courts



- Ethical violations
 - Unauthorised Information
 - Adjust score under Law 16B
 - In extreme cases can also issue PP for breach of Law 73



- Cheating
 - Changing scores
 - Viewing hand records
 - Collusive cheating
- "Running a book"



Accessing hand records

- Give advice about board security
- Use statistical evidence
- Look at the slams!
- Standard of proof –
 "Comfortable satisfaction"
