The French experience 2014-2017

- France won three world open championships between 1992 and 1997
- Since 2003, our Open team hasn't qualified for the Bermuda Bowl.
- In 2013, French federation president, Patrick Grenthe, decided to create a department dedicated to high level: the National technical direction (DTN).
- The DTN took responsibility for a specific project :

France 2017 Project

Lyon will host Bermuda Bowl in 2017.

• On this occasion, French Federation needs a good Open team, able to

compete for a medal, maybe even the title!

We have four years to build it.





Building the team

First step

 Create a group of good « young » players who will commit to putting in the effort.

The « Groupe France »

- Focus on a professional approach
 - Create pairs
 - Players commitment :
- Compete together in enough festivals and national events
 - Training
 - Studying



The Groupe France

Several ways of improving pairs' standard

- Playing against strong foreign opponents
 - Getting invitations
 - Playing training matches reciprocity concept
 - Trying to get some places in Nationals/ Open European/ Cavendish
- Training
 - Playing/bidding on BBO
 - Play often enough in daily events
- Studying bridge technique
 - Technical meetings
 - Hiring specific trainers (bidding, signalling, and so on...)



Choosing the pairs in the group

The Trials

- The six pairs of the group are involved in the trials
- They play three times three days against foreign teams, pairs of the same country being only compared.
- At the end, the first three pairs make the team.



Support around the team

Captain, coach, ...

- The coach takes responsibility for various aspects of bridge technique before and during the championship.
- The captain is THE man of the team. He is in charge of :
 - Team's cohesion
 - Strategic decisions
 - Support for players
- During championships, logistical support from the federation is necessary in case something is going wrong.

Ladies team

- French ladies' team has been successful for years
- Same rules apply for training and playing, but the group particularly two of the pairs existed before.
- Same format (as the Open team) for group building, trials, international matches.
- A dedicated French trainer has been chosen.
- Women (and some juniors) were welcome for most of technical training organized for Open team.







France 2017 project / other teams

Junior and senior

- France 2017 Project didn't involve junior and senior teams.
- Junior team has been involved in its own skill development project for many years.
- Seniors are not involved in the FFB « professional » project. They will survive on their own!



How much does it cost?

- Most important budget items (outside championships):
 - Invitation of foreign teams
 - Players' travel to invitation matches or international tournaments
 - Training and trainers
 - Internal costs of National technical direction
- Total costs for two teams (Open and Ladies)
 - First year : €150,000
 - Subsequent years : €100,000



Who pays?

- Bridge is not recognized as a sport in France
- FFB doesn't get any funding for international matters
- Project France 2017 has been 100% financed from FFB funds
- The cost is high, but affordable in the context of the French Federation budget (a little less than €7,000,000 per year).



The future...

- Players who have lived through this experience have improved.
- Some of them have become recognized champions and received good professional contracts, enough to make a living.
- Unfortunately, some have left, others got sick, some quite seriously, and the group has to be rebuilt now.
- For different reasons, the situation is the same for the women.
- Only one solution for the future: to work hard again!
